Agreement to Binding Arbitration and Waiver of Jury Trail

I, _____, (student) agree that any dispute arising from my enrollment at the Criminal Justice Institute of Southern California (CJISC), no matter how described, pleaded or styled, shall be resolved by binding arbitration under the Federal Arbitration Act conducted by the American Arbitration Association (“AAA”) under its Commercial Rules. The award rendered by the arbitrator may be entered in any court having jurisdiction.

Terms of Arbitration

- Both Student and the College irrevocably agree that any dispute between them shall be submitted to Arbitration.
- Neither the Student nor the Institution shall file or maintain any lawsuit in any court against the other, and agree that any suite filed in violation of this Agreement shall be dismissed by the court in favor of an arbitration conducted pursuant to this Agreement.
- The costs of the arbitration filing fee, arbitrator’s compensation and facilities will be paid by the Institute, to the extent these fees are greater than a Superior Court filing fee.
- The arbitrator’s decision shall be set forth in writing and shall set forth the essential findings and conclusions upon which the decision is based.
- Any remedy available from a court under the law shall be available in the arbitration.
- Nothing in this Agreement prohibits the Student from filing a complaint with the Bureau for Private Post secondary and Vocational Education.

Procedure for Filing Arbitration

- Students are strongly encouraged, but not required, to utilize the Grievance Procedure described in the Catalog, prior to filing arbitration.
- A student desiring to file arbitration should first contact the School Director, who will provide the student with a copy of the AAA Commercial Rules. A Student desiring to file Arbitration should then contact the American Arbitration Association at Anaheim, California, which will provide the appropriate forms and detailed instructions. The Student should bring the form to AAA.
- A student may, but need not, be represented by an attorney at he Arbitration.

Acknowledgment of Waiver of Jury Trial and Available of AAA Rules

By my signature below, I acknowledge that I understand that both the Institute and I are irrevocably waiving rights to a trial by jury, and are selecting instead to submit any and all claims to the decision of an arbitrator instead of a court. I understand that the award of the arbitrator will be binding, and not merely advisory.
